**Call for Manuscripts**

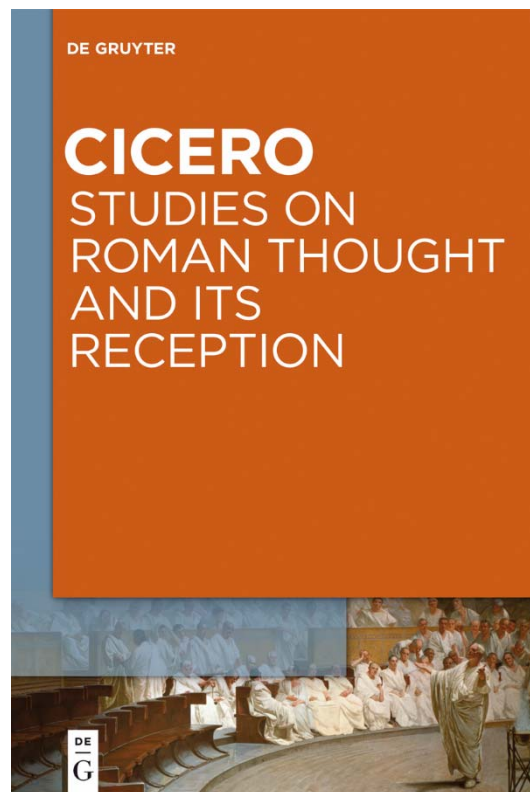
